### **About the Event**

The 2025 World Rowing Championships take place in Shanghai, China from September 21 to 28. This year's World Championships mark the first since the 2024 Paris Olympics

This regatta also marks the return of three Paris 2024 Olympians Nathan Timoney who renews his partnership with Ross Corrigan in the Men's Pair following the 2024 Olympics. Tokyo Olympic bronze medallist Emily Hegarty and double Olympian Aoife Casey mark their return to international racing following the Paris Olympics.

Rowing Ireland will be represented by 24 athletes competing across 12 boat classes. Among them is Emma Waters, who will make her Senior International debut in the Women's Four.

In 2023, Katie O'Brien and Steven McGowan placed 5th in the PR2 Mix2x at the World Championships, securing a place for the Paris 2024 Paralympic Games. At the Games, Tiarnán partnered with Katie O'Brien in the PR2 Mix2x, where they achieved a top-ten finish.

A relative newcomer to rowing, Tiarnán has already shown immense potential, transitioning from being one of Ireland's top wheelchair basketball players to rowing. Tiarnán competed at the 2024 Paris Paralympics in the PR2 Mixed Double Sculls alongside Katie O'Brien. The double marked Ireland's return to Paralympic rowing since London 2012. He also won silver at the 2024 World Rowing Cup II and III in the PR2 single sculls. In 2025, Tiarnán won a gold medal at the World Cup I in Varese. This marked Tiarnán's first gold medal on the international circuit, just one year after making his international debut.



Mags Cremen won silver in the Lightweight Women's Single Sculls (LW1x) at the 2024 European Rowing Championships. Siobhán McCrohan claimed gold at the World Cup II in 2024 and went on to win bronze at the 2024 World Championships, adding to her gold from the previous year. At the 2025 World Cup II, Siobhán McCrohan returned to the LW1x and finished fifth.

Siobhán made a comeback to the rowing scene in 2023 after a seven year hiatus. Since her return to rowing Siobhán won a gold medal at the 2023 World Championships and bronze at the 2024 World Championships. She also won the gold medal in the LW1x at last year's World Cup II. At the 2025 World Cup II, Siobhán returned to the LW1x and finished fifth.





In 2025, Fiona transitioned to the Women's Single Scull, claiming silver medals at both the European Championships and World Cup II. A former junior with Galway Rowing Club, she represented the University of Galway before transferring to Fordham University in New York, where she won the Head of the Charles Regatta twice in succession.

Shanghai 2025 marks her first World Championships competing in the heavyweight category.

In 2022, Zoe Hyde won a bronze medal at the World Rowing Championships and secured a silver medal at World Cup II in the Women's Double Sculls (W2x). Ireland are the Olympic bronze medallists in the Men's Double Sculls, with Philip Doyle and Daire Lynch making history as the first Irish crew to medal in men's heavyweight rowing at the Games. For the 2025 World Championships, Philip Doyle returns to the M2x alongside double Olympic champion Fintan McCarthy. Earlier in 2025, Fintan claimed bronze at both the European Championships and World Cup II in the M2x with Konan Pazzaia.

The duo then went on to win gold at the 2024 Paris Olympics in the LM2x, being the first Irish duo to win back to back gold medals at the Olympics. Fintan made his heavyweight debut this year at the European Championships where he won a bronze medal in the Men's Double Scull.

In 2023, Nathan won a bronze medal in the Men's Pair with Ross Corrigan at the World Championships, qualifying for the 2024 Paris Olympics. Ross and Nathan finished 6<sup>th</sup> at the Paris Olympics. This regatta marks Nathan's return to international racing since the Olympics.


